# Directions to the Event

From the North: Route 79 South towards Washington, PA. Travel 19.6 miles on 79 South to Exit 45 at Canonsburg. Turn Left off the exit ramp onto McClelland Road. Travel 1.3 miles to the Route 19 intersection (by King's Restaurant). Turn Left at the light onto Route 19 heading north. Travel 3 miles on Route 19 and turn Left at the light onto Hidden Valley Road by Bob Evans Restaurant. Valley Brook Country Club is at the end of Hidden Valley Road (approximately 1.5 miles). (You will have gone too far on Route 19 if you pass South Hills Chrysler Jeep on the left.)

From the South: Follow I-79 North for approximately 6.5 miles to Exit 45 (Canonsburg). Turn Right on to Weavertown Road. Travel .5 mile to light and turn Left onto Route 19 North. Continue 4.2 miles and turn Left at the light onto Hidden Valley Road by Bob Evans Restaurant. Valley Brook Country Club is at the end of Hidden Valley Road (approximately 1.5 miles). (You will have gone too far on Route 19 if you pass South Hills Chrysler Jeep on the left.)
